I see more details with learning behaviours of others and natures connections. My senses are more in tune. After dealing with loss, and chronic pain for the past few years, where my every day life was a challenge, including being creative, there is much that needs to regrow from my soul. Wrens, Spinebills, Thornbills, Curruwongs, Ravens, Rosellas, Parrots, Sparrows, Blackbirds, Wattle birds, Butterflies, Bees, Wasps, Beetles, Mollusks, Possums and so many other little creatures visit and nurture our part of earth. We have helped grow a garden for all, and in turn, my soul is nourished. As someone who is focused on the details, the garden journey has brought about many creative paths in every day life. I'd like to bring these details into light, and express them through illustrations, written works, and images, and hope that this may inspire others to observe, learn, and create their own path and journey.
